



SESSION AIM

KEY EMPHASES FOR THIS LESSON



Rooted in the Apostles' Teaching

The Church remained grounded in God's Word, building on the foundation of the apostles.



Deep Fellowship

They devoted themselves to one another, creating a community of love and trust.



Breaking of Bread

They regularly shared meals, celebrating Christ's Supper with joy and unity.



Prayer Was Central

Prayer shaped their dependence on God and empowered their mission.



The Lord Added Daily

God was at work, adding to their number those who were being saved.



Maturity and Favor

They grew in maturity, and both the people and God were well pleased with them.



Reproducing Communities

Their life together became a model that spread, planting new groups and strengthening the Church.

COMMON CONFUSIONS

- 1 Growth was not just because of numbers.** It was healthy, Spirit-led growth in faith and maturity.
- 2 Community was not programs or events.** It was a way of life marked by devotion and generosity.
- 3 Material sharing was voluntary, not forced.** It flowed from love and trust, not obligation.
- 4 This pattern is not only for the first century.** These principles are timeless and for the Church today.
