02. CHRISTIANITY CANNOT BE LIVED ALONE

Why Jesus Calls Believers Into Real Community



CORE TEACHING

Teach the main ideas
clearly and simply.

- 1 GOD DID NOT DESIGN US TO DO LIFE ALONE.**
From the beginning, God created people for relationship. Even Jesus lived in community. (Genesis 2:18; Mark 3:13–15)
➤ We are wired for connection.
- 2 ISOLATION WEAKENS FAITH.**
When we pull away, we become vulnerable to doubt, discouragement, and temptation. Staying connected to God's people helps us stay close to Jesus. (Proverbs 18:1; Ecclesiastes 4:9–10)
➤ We need others to help us persevere.
- 3 THE CHURCH ENCOURAGES GROWTH.**
In the early church, believers devoted themselves to teaching, fellowship, prayer, and sharing life together. That is where real growth happened. (Acts 2:42–47)
➤ Community helps faith grow deeper.
- 4 ACCOUNTABILITY HELPS US STAY ON TRACK.**
Others can speak truth in love, help us repent, and support us when we struggle. (Proverbs 27:17; Galatians 6:1–2)
➤ We all need friends who will speak truth.
- 5 TOGETHER, WE REFLECT CHRIST'S KINGDOM.**
When we love, serve, worship, and care for one another, the world sees Jesus through us. That is the church's mission. (John 13:34–35)
➤ United, we show the world who Jesus is.



REAL-LIFE CONNECTION

Help students apply truth to
everyday life.

Think about today's culture:

- We can message anyone, anytime.
- We can watch endless content.
- We can "connect" online.
- But many people still feel lonely.

Real community takes time, effort, vulnerability, and commitment. But it is where transformation actually happens.



Jesus invites us into something better than digital connection—real, lasting, Christ-centered community where we can belong and become like Him.



PRAYER FOCUS

- Thank Jesus for calling us into His family.
- Ask God to help us value real community.
- Pray for your church and the people in it.
- Ask God to help you love, encourage, and serve others well.



LEADER NOTES

- Some students have had negative experiences in church. Offer grace and help them see God's heart.
- Keep the conversation focused on Scripture, not opinions.
- Look for opportunities to affirm and encourage.
- Point students to Jesus in every discussion.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Guide your group to
think deeper.

- 1** What are some reasons people try to follow Jesus on their own?
Follow-up: What are the dangers of that?
- 2** How does being part of a church family help you grow in faith?
Follow-up: Can you share an example from your life?
- 3** What are some ways the early church (Acts 2) focused on life together?
Follow-up: Which of those areas are hardest for us today?
- 4** Who encourages you in your faith right now?
Follow-up: How can you encourage others?
- 5** How does gathered worship and community look different from online faith content?
Follow-up: What can online content never replace?



DISCUSSION TIP: Invite everyone to share, but never force. Listen well, ask follow-up questions, and keep the conversation grounded in Scripture and grace.
