The Christian Life Was Designed To Be Shared



CORE TEACHING

*Teach the main ideas
clearly and simply.*

1 LOVE ONE ANOTHER.

This is Jesus' greatest command (John 13:34–35). Our love for each other shows the world we are His disciples.

➤ Love is the foundation of Christian community.

2 BEAR ONE ANOTHER'S BURDENS.

We all face struggles. Galatians 6:2 calls us to help others carry what is too heavy for them.

➤ We don't have to fix everything, but we can walk with others.

3 ENCOURAGE ONE ANOTHER DAILY.

Hebrews 3:13 urges us to encourage each other so no one drifts away from faith.

➤ Your words can strengthen someone's faith.

4 SERVE ONE ANOTHER HUMBLY.

Jesus washed His disciples' feet (John 13:14–15). Serving others is not beneath us — it is how we reflect Christ.

➤ Look for ways to serve in big and small ways.

5 FORGIVE ONE ANOTHER.

Ephesians 4:32 calls us to be kind, compassionate, and forgiving — just as God forgave us in Christ.

➤ Forgiveness keeps our community healthy.



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

*Guide your group
to think deeper.*

1 Which "one another" command from Scripture speaks to you the most right now? Why?

Follow-up: How would it change your week if you lived that out?

2 When has someone in the church encouraged you in your faith?

Follow-up: What impact did it have on you?

3 Is it easy or hard for you to ask for help when you're struggling? Why?

Follow-up: Who could you lean on more?

4 What are some practical ways you can serve others in your youth group or church?

Follow-up: What is one way you will serve this week?

5 Have you ever had to forgive someone in the church? What was that like?

Follow-up: How did forgiveness change things?

6 What would our youth group look like if we truly lived these "one another" commands?

Follow-up: What's one step we can take together?



DISCUSSION TIP: Create a safe space. Encourage everyone to share, but never force. Listen well and keep the conversation centered on Scripture and grace.



REAL-LIFE CONNECTION

*Help students apply
truth to everyday life.*

Christian community is more than being in the same building. It is showing up for one another.

Think about your life:

- Who encourages you when you're down?
- Who can you encourage this week?
- Who might be carrying something heavy right now?
- How can you be more intentional about loving and serving others?

★ When we love, serve, encourage, and forgive, people see Jesus in us.



WEEKLY CHALLENGE

*Put faith into
action this week.*

Choose one or more challenges to live out:

- ✔ Encourage one person in your youth group.
- ✔ Help someone who is carrying something heavy.
- ✔ Look for a way to serve without being asked.
- ✔ Forgive someone and pray for them.
- ✔ Speak life and build others up every day.

PRAYER FOCUS

- Thank Jesus for loving us first.
- Ask God to help us love others well.
- Pray for people in our church who are hurting.
- Ask God to grow our unity and our hearts for one another.



LEADER NOTES

- Model the "one another" commands in your leadership.
- Be aware of students who may be struggling and quietly reach out.
- Use examples from Scripture and real life.
- Keep pointing students to Jesus as the example and source of our love.
