08. THE CHURCH IS AN OUTPOST OF ANOTHER KINGDOM

Living As Citizens Of Christ's Kingdom



CORE TEACHING

1 CHRISTIANS BELONG TO ANOTHER KINGDOM Philippians 3:20

Believers may live in this world, but our ultimate loyalty belongs to: **Jesus Christ**.

Christians are:

- citizens of Christ's Kingdom
- representatives of Jesus
- part of a different way of living

➤ **Emphasize:** *Our identity is rooted in Christ before culture.*

2 JESUS CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO BE LIGHT Matthew 5:14-16

The church is meant to be:

- visible • distinct • loving
- truthful • faithful

Christians should not hide their faith, but neither should they become arrogant or hostile.

➤ **Emphasize:** *Believers reflect Christ through both holiness and love.*

3 CHRISTIANS LIVE DIFFERENTLY 1 Peter 2:9-12

The world often promotes:

- selfishness • pride • greed
- sexual confusion • anger • self-focus

Jesus calls His people toward:

- holiness • humility • truth
- compassion • purity • faithfulness

➤ **Emphasize:** *Following Jesus should shape how we live daily.*

4 JESUS SENDS BELIEVERS INTO THE WORLD John 17:14-18

Christians are not called to:

- isolate from people • hate the world
- escape culture completely

Jesus sends believers into the world to:

- love others • serve faithfully
- proclaim truth • reflect Christ visibly

➤ **Emphasize:** *Christians are missionaries within everyday life.*

PRAYER FOCUS

Thank the Father for calling believers into Christ's Kingdom.

Ask the Spirit to help students live faithfully, courageously, lovingly, and visibly for Jesus in the world around them.



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Guide your group to think deeper.

1 What pressures do teenagers face to fit in with culture?

Follow-up: Why do people fear standing out?

2 How should Christians be different from the world?

Follow-up: What is the difference between holiness and self-righteousness?

3 Why is it difficult to live faithfully sometimes?

Follow-up: What helps Christians remain faithful?

4 How can Christians show both truth and love together?

Follow-up: Why do people often separate those things?

5 What does it mean to represent Jesus at school, online, or with friends?

Follow-up: What is one practical way you could reflect Christ this week?



DISCUSSION TIP: Avoid creating fear, hostility, or "us vs. them" thinking.

Focus on faithful witness, not cultural panic.

Students should leave seeing the beauty of belonging to Christ's Kingdom.

REAL LIFE CONNECTION

Teenagers constantly experience pressure to:

- fit in • gain approval • follow trends
- avoid standing out

But Christians are called to follow Jesus even when it costs something.

The church should become:

- a visible witness • a loving community
- a picture of Christ's Kingdom in the world



WEEKLY CHALLENGE

Challenge students to intentionally:

- ☑ reflect Christ publicly
- ☑ show kindness courageously
- ☑ speak truth graciously
- ☑ stand firm in an area of pressure

Put faith into action this week.

★ **Ask:** "How can I visibly reflect Jesus this week?"

LEADER NOTES

- ✓ Avoid culture-war rhetoric.
- ✓ Emphasize hope, not fear.
- ✓ Keep Christ central, not politics or outrage.
- ✓ Encourage faithful witness over isolation.
- ✓ Help students connect Kingdom identity to daily life.

YOUR ROLE

- ✓ Encourage thoughtful discussion
- ✓ Keep the tone hopeful and Christ-centered
- ✓ Help students think critically about culture
- ✓ Emphasize love and holiness together
- ✓ Point students toward faithful witness
